Banbury Cross Players are pleased to announce Open Auditions for the final show of our 2015/2016 Season – a **Theatrical Feast** in the form of an evening of three one-act plays. A challenging trio of two-handers to whet your acting appetite, the plays are as follows:

David Tristram's **Peas**: Gerry and Daisy are the first to test out a new dating agency and quickly discover how much they have in common - including Star Wars, Chinese food, Wagner and sex.

David Tristram's **The Extraordinary Revelations of Orca the Goldfish**: For Henry Smith (actor, business tycoon, comedian, Casanova and acting US President) life was rarely dull. For his housewife, wife, Alice, it was rarely anything else. Until, that is, French waiter, Michel (tall, dark and available) enters. Fantasy blurs into reality, secret passions explode and only Orca the Goldfish knows the truth.

Harold Pinter's **The Dumb Waiter**: Hitmen Ben and Gus, wait in a basement room for their next assignment. Ben reads his newspaper. Gus ties his shoelaces. The dialogue progresses to argument. The dumb waiter in the back of the room occasionally delivers food .. and eventually the details of their assignment. But who will be left standing?

Auditions will take place on Thursday 7 April 2016, 8pm, at The Mill Arts Centre, Spiceball Park Rd, Banbury, OX16 5QE. A read through and presentation by the directors will take place on Tuesday 22 March 2016, 8pm at The Mill Arts Centre — everyone welcome.

You do not have to be a member to audition but will be asked to join if cast. You will need to be available from 10 July 2016 for technical and dress rehearsals prior to performance from 13-16 July 2016.
