John Buchan's original novel, The 39 Steps - one of his series starring the hero Richard Hannay - has been consistently popular since it was published in 1915. Three films have been produced (1935, 1959 and 1978) but not one of the film-makers stayed true to the original story and all with their own interpretation of the meaning of "the 39 steps".

The best film has to be Hitchcock's 1935 black and white version, adapted by playwright Charles Bennett, Ian Hay and Hitchcock. It is this version we reproduce tonight, as a stage show, using cast and crew to produce a 'B' movie style theatre production. The serious spy story is played mainly for laughs and the script is full of allusions to (and puns on) Hitchcock films, including *Psycho*, *Strangers on a Train*, *Vertigo* and *North by Northwest*. How many can you spot? In true Hitchcock style, the man himself makes a guest appearance!

The play is written as a homage to Hitchcock - a pastiche of the film, an artistic piece consisting chiefly of techniques borrowed from the film. The script bears a resemblance to the film and although it is a spoof, comedy version, it is not meant to make fun of the film, but to pay tribute through mimicry.



The play is performed as though it were the making of a film where the audience have to suspend disbelief as they see props, furniture and even the cast doubling up. The backstage crew (likely to belong to the film set) are also involved, making sure the play runs its course, whilst not taking the time or trouble to disguise their action (in a film they can leave that up to the editing suite, of course!)

In the making of a 'B' movie, the funders were likely to be too impoverished to use realistic sound effects so relied on the many skills of the orchestra and conductor, a small group of budding actors desperate to do an excellent job with a fairly difficult script. Our live sound effect orchestra looks to emulate that in tonight's performance.



I am thrilled to be directing again for Banbury Cross Players. Working with such talented and supportive people on this show has been great, and I hope you have as much fun watching, as I have had producing.
