Harold Pinter was born in the working-class neighbourhood of East London's Hackney, the son of a Jewish tailor. One of the most acclaimed contemporary British playwrights, he began acting at his grammar school and later went to the Royal Academy of Arts. He left after two years and spent most of the 1950s writing poetry. In 1957 he wrote his first play *The Room. The Birthday Party* came a year

later and his next play, *The Caretaker* (1960), won him many accolades. *The Dumb Waiter* (also written in 1960) helped cement Pinter's status as a major theatrical figure.

His works blend comedy and drama and focus on jealousy, betrayal and sexual politics. But it is his dialogue (or lack thereof), with those ominous and violent silences, for which he is known. The true nature and



motivation of his characters emerge in these silences. He was awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature in 2005. Pinter died in 2008, aged 78.

**David Tristram** was born in Quarry Bank and educated at Dudley Grammar School and Birmingham University, where he studied English and Music. A commercial copywriter, Tristram fell into writing

in 1985 dreaming up a comedy whodunnit to help out a friend working for an amateur dramatics group.

Thirty years later the playwright has enjoyed



Thirty years later the playwright has enjoyed unprecedented success having become the UK's most popular comedy playwright (according to the world's largest publisher of plays, Samuel French). Performed by amateur and professional groups, his plays

take a farcical view on many aspects of life - sex, alcohol, drugs, crime, lazy cow syndrome, and theatre itself.

His plays can be seen all over the world - from Argentine to Vienna! On average there are at least two Tristram plays being performed somewhere in the world every night of the year.
